The OUMC Church Council met on January 27th under the leadership of Council Chair, Sylvia Harrison.

Your Council approved the 2024 budget, affirmed that OUMC will request a summer intern from Duke again this year, and heard an update from Donna Critcher on the Oxford Women in Mission.

Pastor Glenn gave a teaching on small groups in the faith community, with the origins of small groups dating back to the time of John Wesley.

If you don't cook, bring your appetite!


Voting is done monetarily.

Thanks to everyone who came out to support the Blood Drive on February 24th. We collected **30** units of blood!




