The mission of the Oxford United Methodist Church is to love God, love people, and faithfully minister to human and spiritual needs in our community and beyond.

Message from Pastor Glenn

The day of Pentecost falls 50 days after Easter Sunday. Acts 2 describes the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, a day when people from around the world had gathered to worship in Jerusalem. Pentecost reminds us that the presence of the risen Christ remains with the church even after he has ascended to heaven. Our denominational logo -- the United Methodist cross and flame -- serves as a reminder of the ongoing power of the Holy Spirit, who gives witness to the power of the Son.

The time after Pentecost, therefore, is when the church remembers it's calling to move by the direction and power of the Spirit. We call this ordinary time on our church calendar, because it is a season when we are not actively preparing for or celebrating the major festivals of Christmas or Easter. The "ordinary" work of the church is to be doing the Spirit-powered work of Jesus: healing, forgiving, loving, and going. In this edition of Tower Tidings you will see many opportunities to serve in seemingly ordinary ways. Consider, for instance, the Community Supported Agriculture program that supports a local farmer and brings you freshly harvested (that is, healthy) produce each week. Check out the Repair Cafe, a new community service effort that we are hosting on June 24. Bring your appliances and devices to be repaired, or sign up to be a volunteer. Or volunteer to help at one of our Summer Literacy sessions that run from June to August.

It is a great privilege to join in God's "ordinary" work of changing lives and transforming the world.

Monetary donations can be made through CashApp (\$acimfood), through mail (P.O. Box 398, Oxford, NC 27565), or through drop off during open hours.



Staff Parish Relations

The Staff Parish Relations Committee: Who are they and what do they do?

The OUMC Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC), chaired by Adam Mincher, meets at least quarterly and as-needed in the event of personnel issues that arise.

Your SPRC members, along with Adam, are: Ruby Stine, David Matlock, Karen Dickerson, Lennie Blackley, Sylvia Harrison, and Kathrine Noel (Lay Leader).

According to the United Methodist Book of Discipline, the duties of the SPRC, in general, are:

- Encourage the pastor and his/her family.
- Meet with the pastor to discuss the effectiveness of ministry, relationships within the congregation, conditions that may impede the effectiveness of ministry, and to interpret the nature and function of the ministry.
- Confer with the pastor if it becomes evident that the best interest of the church and pastor would be service by a change of pastor.
- Discuss with the pastor and staff matters pertaining to priorities in the use of gifts, skills, and time.
- Consult with pastor and staff regarding the importance of continuing education and spiritual renewal.
- Provide pastor and staff evaluations annually.
- Provide staff job descriptions.
- Promote unity in the church.

At OUMC, each SPRC member is assigned to a staff person as a way of keeping in contact, forging a relationship, and being a liaison between the staff person and our congregation. We enjoy learning more about our staff individually! We also are assessing our Employee Handbook, and will update it to reflect any new laws and guidance.

Your SPRC members are happy to serve our Lord and our church. Though SPRC meetings are always closed meetings due to the personnel-related issues we must address, we are open to your input and ideas! Contact Adam Mincher at adam.mincher@gmail.com.
